## Leviticus 4:1–35, 6:24–30

Year 1, lesson 21

Leviticus picks up where Exodus left off. God brought the Israelites out of Egypt after being enslaved for 400 years. He now shows His people a picture of what He expects from them after being set free. ▲

### **Observation: *what does it say?***

Read Leviticus 4:1–35 & 6:24–30. Mark: *sin, sin offering, blood atonement, soothing aroma to the Lord, consecrated, holy.*

### **Interpretation: *what does the author mean?***

2. From your reading, how would you define the word *atonement*? What is the dictionary definition?
3. Read Hebrews 10:19–22. What does Christ’s blood do for us? Why don’t we offer sacrifices today?

### **Application: *therefore, what shall I do?***

4. The fat of the sin offering was a “soothing aroma” to God. How can you be a “soothing aroma to the Lord”? What do you need to do in order to be a “soothing aroma”?
5. We learned in Leviticus that God takes all sin seriously whether it’s intentional or unintentional. What does this teach you about how God wants you to handle sin in your life? Are you confessing all or any of the sins in your life? Do you have an accountability partner?
