



Genesis 6:5–7:24

Year 1, lesson 3

God is just. He judges sin and rescues the righteous. It has always been this way since the “beginning.” Take a fresh look at Noah and God’s judgement on the earth. ▲

Observation: *what does it say?*

1. Read Genesis 6:5–7:24. Mark God/Lord, Noah, earth, covenant (only once)
2. Why did God decide to blot out man?
3. How does God describe Noah?
4. What does God tell Noah that He is going to do? What does He instruct Noah to do?
5. Draw a picture of the ark here — use the information from verses 6:14–16.
6. Who establishes the covenant in 6:18?

Interpretation: *what does the author mean?*

7. Was this a local flood or a global flood? Which verses give you this answer?

8. In Genesis 1 and 2, everything that God made was described as “good.” In these chapters, the earth is described as “corrupt.” What happened?

Application: *therefore, what shall I do?*

9. Who caused this flood? Does God cause floods today?

10. You know that God is an amazing Creator and the He made man in His own image. HHow could a good God allow all these people to drown? What do you say to someone who says – “That doesn’t sound very “good” to me! Why would I worship a God who causes death and destruction like that?”

11. Noah is described as righteous, blameless in his time and as “walking with God.” He also “did all that God had commanded him.” In what ways are you like Noah? How would God describe you?
